Youth unemployment is high, and many young people who have dropped out of school are low-skilled and face difficulties in getting a job. This is especially true for the disabled and those belonging to ethnic minorities, who face discrimination from education and employers.

WHAT? The project will focus on innovation and technology in the agricultural sector and create a Toolkit for young people who are no longer in the education system, not working or being trained for work (NEETs). The Toolkit will include online & on-the-spot trainings, youth competition, staff exchange and mentoring services.

WHERE? The geographical coverage of the project:

- Territorially it covers eNEET Rural partnering countries consisting of partners from Bulgaria, Hungary, Italy, Romania, Slovenia and Spain;
